We use a combination of fixed and removable retainers in order to achieve the best long-term result. Our usual office fee will be charged for retainer replacement, worn-out retainers or to repair loose fixed retainers. If a fixed retainer wire comes off the teeth completely,

please save it and we can most likely re-cement it. If we have to make a new one, there will be an additional fee. Retainers are like eyeglasses, contact



lenses, or any other type of personal item that is worn daily—they will wear out.

Impacted Canines

In about 4% of the population, the upper canine (3rd tooth from the center line of the upper two front teeth) does not come in naturally in the proper position. It heads towards the roof

of the mouth where is usually stops erupting until it is uncovered by an oral surgeon. This kind of tooth is called a palatally impacted canine and it can add a year to the time you are in braces.

We now know that palatally impacted canines are a genetic problem and that it runs in families. If you had an impacted canine or your dad or mom had it or a brother or sister, you are much more likely to have the same problem.



We now also know of ways to prevent impacted canines in 90% of our patients with some relatively simple preventive procedures. Ideally, this is done or started around age 10.

If your family has a history of palatally impacted canines, let us try to prevent future problems by intercepting the impaction early. We'd be happy to do this for any of your family members: children, nieces or nephews. Just call the office and we'll see them for a screening appointment. No referral is necessary from your family dentist.

Sports & Teeth

Because we know a lot of our patients are active and play sports, we wanted to take a moment to remind you how critical it is to protect your teeth, whether you are playing full-contact football or a game of pick-up basketball. Today, we thought we would answer some of the most frequent questions we get from patients:

Q: Why do sports teams require mouth guard?

If you play or are planning on playing sports, it's important that you take special precautions, such as wearing a mouth guard. The guard will protect your teeth from impact and in most instances prevent teeth from becoming chipped or broken. Mouth guards are advisable for playing sports such as baseball, football, soccer, basketball, and many, many more.

Q: If I'm hit in the mouth, and a tooth gets knocked out, what should I do?

- 1. Find the tooth
- 2. Hold the tooth by the crown (the surface farthest from the gumline), not the root
- 3. If it is an adult tooth, try to put the tooth back in the socket right away
- 4. If the tooth can not be put back in the socket, store it in cold milk (do not store in tap water)
- 5. Bite down on a gauze pad to relieve bleeding and pain
- 6. Call your dentist immediately

Q: Can I still wear a mouth guard with braces?

Yes, a mouth guard is a must while playing contact sports with braces! You may use the kind you can pick up at Olympia Sports (Shock Doctor is one brand we know of) that can be reboiled over and over to allow for the movement of the teeth.

Q: What type of mouth guard is good now that I am out of braces?

Now that your braces are off you can have a custom made mouth guard made at our office. The kids that have them LOVE them since they can still talk easily to their teammates and they stay in your mouth.
